American Sentinel University prepares this report to comply with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Crime Statistics Act (Clery Act). This report is prepared in cooperation with local law enforcement agencies. Nothing in the law shall be construed to permit a school to retaliate, intimidate, threaten, coerce, or otherwise discriminate against any individual with respect to the implementation of the Clery Act.

The University attempts to provide students and employees with a safe and secure environment in which to study and work. The offices are open during posted hours. University offices are secured during times the school is not open. American Sentinel does not have any on-ground campus or residential facilities for students.

Personal Safety

While the University attempts to provide a safe and secure environment, students, faculty, staff, and campus visitors are ultimately responsible for their own safety. Safety is enhanced when students and employees take precautions such as:

- Report all suspicious activities to the local police immediately.
- Never take personal safety for granted.
- Avoid walking alone at night.
- Avoid parking or walking in secluded or dimly lit areas.
- Carry only small amounts of cash.
- Never leave valuables unattended.
- Carry your keys with you at all times and do not lend them.
- Lock your car doors and close the windows when leaving your car.

Reporting a Crime

If a student or employee is aware that a crime has been, or is being committed on University property or at a school sponsored or recognized event off-campus, the crime should be reported immediately to the President or the designated Safety Officer and to the local police. In an emergency, the local police department can be reached at 911.

The University does not have a campus police or security department. The University works with local law enforcement agencies and refers criminal incidents to the local police department having jurisdiction over such matters.

The University does not tolerate violence or threatening conduct against any members of the University community. This includes criminal acts against person or property, as well as harassment based on sex, race, ethnicity, gender orientation, or disability. The University will impose strict disciplinary actions and appropriately involve law enforcement officials should any acts of violence or threatening occur on University property or *in the online environment*.



In addition to any criminal sanctions, the University will impose appropriate disciplinary sanctions if the offender is a student or employee of the University. The University President should be contacted if someone wishes to file a complaint.

Registered Sex Offenders

The Jacob Wetterling Act requires states to obtain information concerning registered sex offenders' enrollment or employment at institutions of higher education. Those seeking to obtain information about registered sex offenders should visit the following website: www.snoopr.gov. To the extent the State notifies an educational institution of information concerning registered sex offenders, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) does not prevent educational institutions from disclosing such information.

Disciplinary Proceedings

The University will, upon written request, disclose to the alleged victim of a crime of violence or a non-forcible sex offence, the results of any disciplinary hearing conducted by the University against the student who is the alleged perpetrator of the crime or offense. If the alleged victim is deceased as a result of the crime or offense, the University will provide the results of the disciplinary hearing to the victim's next of kin, if so requested.
